# **LEADERSHIP OBJECTIVES:**

- Identify and select qualified leaders to participate in the program.

## \*IMPORTANT INFORMATION\*

- ◆ Due to the costs involved with program participation, once an applicant has been accepted into the program and confirms their commitment to participate, tuition becomes non-refundable. Withdrawal from the program due to extreme circumstances (hospitalization, military duty, death, or other extreme situations) can be appealed to the Weirton Area Chamber for a case-by-case review.
- Advisors are available to offer guidance and answer questions. It is the responsibility of the participants to plan their assigned session and make the necessary arrangements. Any problems in this area should be brought to the attention of the *Leadership Ohio Valley* Coordinators or Chamber Office immediately.
- Sessions are to be scheduled on the day of the month selected by the participants. The length of the sessions are determined by each subcommittee. They should try to be a full workday.
